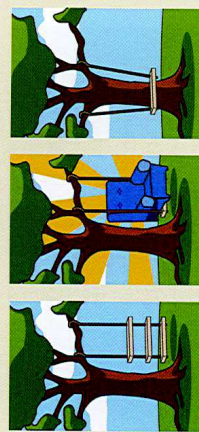
Speculating

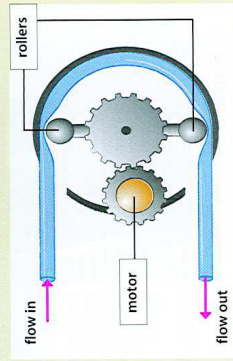
Call my bluff

- Read three definitions of the word *adze*. Only one definition is correct and the other two are false. Guess which one is correct.

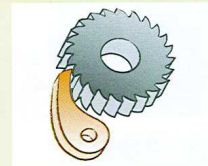
- If you need to cut or shape a large piece of wood, you need an adze. It's a heavy tool with a curved blade which is positioned at right angles to the handle. In American English it's spelt *adz*.



- An adze is a special kind of pump that squeezes liquid along a hose. It has two or more rollers which squeeze the hose and force the liquid to move. The good thing about an adze is it prevents the liquid from coming into contact with the pump mechanism.



- An adze is a kind of gear which has a stick that works like a brake. The stick allows the gear to turn in one direction, but not the other. Adzes are often used for lifting equipment.
